These or similar classes must be completed by anyone, of any age, operating a motor boat with a 10 or more horsepower engine in Virginia waters after July 1, 2016. These classes have been required of all personal water craft (jet- ski) operators since July 1, 2012 no matter their age (except no one under age 14 can operate a jet ski even if they had passed a boating safety class). In every instance the vessel operator must carry and show proof of class completion; this can be the course completion card issued by the Coast Guard Auxiliary or the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries shown here,
